DID YOU KNOW?

- 75 percent of the nation's nursing faculty are expected to retire by 2019.
- In 2004, the American Association of Colleges of Nursing reported that schools across the country turned away more than 26,000 qualified applicants, primarily due to faculty shortages.
- A 2009 survey of Quad Cities nursing programs found 15 faculty openings, 35 anticipated retirements by 2020 among 75 full-time faculty, and 650 nursing student applications for 400 student spots.
